**100 Club Requests Donations to “Survivor’s Fund”
After the Death of
Pasadena Police Officer Jesse Hamilton**

The 100 Club announced today that donations are being accepted to its “Survivor’s Fund” which provides benefits to the dependents of peace officers and firefighters who are killed in the line of duty.

Officer Jesse Hamilton, 29, died in the line of duty on Friday morning, August 21, 2009, after being shot by a suspect while responding to a disturbance call at a residence in Pasadena.

Officer Hamilton had been an Officer with the Pasadena Police Department for four years. He is survived by his wife and two young children.

A \$10,000 check will be given to Officer Hamilton’s family to assist with any needs they may have. Additional financial support for the family will be provided, after a review is made by the Club, to include current financial and children’s educational needs.
